Dear fellow NAFC Member,

There are two seasons in the Pennaz household: fishing and planning.

Of course, I enjoy the fishing season more than the planning, but then there is something uniquely enjoyable about considering the fishing options available in the coming year or even two.

Winter is my favorite time to plan. I'll start a fire in the fireplace and page through past issues of favorite magazines like *North American Fisherman*, check out a few websites, call a few buddies, and basically start poking around.

My goal is simple: to identify fisheries that are peaking, for one reason or another, or locate that great new fishing spot (or operations) that others haven't found yet.

I also use the opportunity to reconnect with old friends, conversations that often lead to days on the water, some just out my back door, others that may involve travel.

One of the most effective exercises when planning a trip, whether it be a weekend jaunt to a local lake or a 7-day trip to a wilderness resort, is to define my primary goals for going. Catching a mess of catfish for the pan is one thing; targeting giant marlin is another.

The more exotic the trip, the more time I spend focusing on goals.

Here are four goals I set for a recent trip:

1. Potential for big fish. For that reason, lodges/camps that required anglers to release trophy fish were given priority over those that allowed the harvest of large fish.
2. The accommodations had to be comfortable and clean, and close to the fishery.
3. The boats used had to have enough power to cover a lot of water quickly, and be seaworthy enough to handle big water.
4. Price was also a big factor. Like always, lower is better than higher, but I also know you get what you pay for. I'll spend a little more to fish top-notch destinations at peak times.

Fortunately, there are several superb sources of information. In my searches, I start with this book, *North American Fisherman* magazine and other angling publications, friends, sports shows and the internet (especially fishingclub.com) to not only identify potential destinations, but also to begin narrowing them down to a manageable number.

Then I begin investigating package options, prime fishing times and travel. My favorite trips are those that offer 3-5 days of fishing. That way I can fish hard for the length of the trip, but not get burnt out after several days on the water.

The downside of shorter trips is the higher risk of weather issues and poor fishing.

Fuel costs will be an issue this year, as will the weak U.S. dollar if your travel to Canada or other foreign countries. Also, remember that a valid U.S. passport is now required to get back into the U.S.

When's the best time to book that "trip of a lifetime?" RIGHT NOW. The prices will never be lower, the fishing never better, than right now!

So start planning!

GENERAL INFORMATION

Approval Process

In order for a fishing service to be approved and be eligible to be included in this directory, it must receive at least a 75 percent recommended rating from North American Fishing Club members who have submitted reports on the service. A minimum of two reports submitted within the last three years is also required.

Submitting a Fishing Report

NAFC members who would like to report on a guide, camp, or charter service may download or request an official NAFC Fishing Report form by logging onto the Club Web site at fishingclub.com, or may request a form by calling the Club Member Services Department at (800) 843-6232.

Things to Remember when Using a Fishing Service

NAFC members should obtain current licensing information for guide/charter services from the government agencies in the state or province in which they plan to fish.

Members should also be aware that some laws state that individuals using the services of an unlicensed guide/charter may be held in violation of the law. Because annual license renewals do not have a common date, the NAFC cannot guarantee that any of the listed services hold a current license even though a license number may be listed.

NAFC members who know of incorrect information pertaining to names, addresses, phone numbers, etc. in this directory should send updated information to: NAFC—FRD, PO Box 3430, Minnetonka, MN 55343.

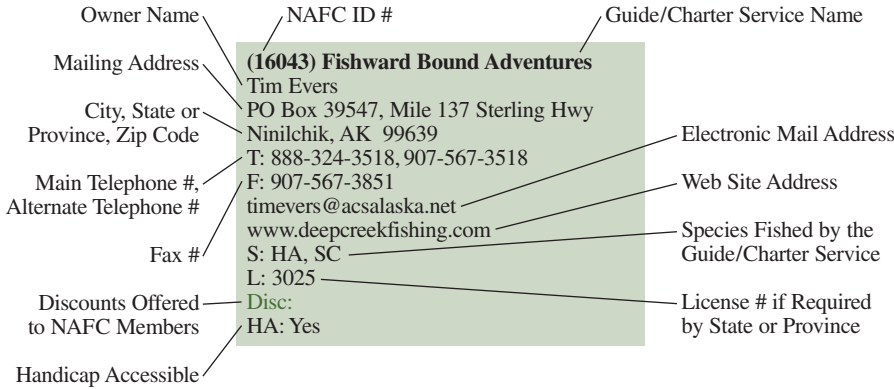

NAFC CATCH & RELEASE TIPS FOR RELEASING FISH SAFELY

- 1) Keep the fight time to a minimum, and play the fish to hand as quickly as possible.
- 2) Use a knotless catch and release net, or better yet, no net at all.
- 3) Use barbless hooks when possible. They're easier to set and easier to remove, causing far less tissue damage than barbed hooks.
- 4) When handling the fish, wet your hands before touching it, and support it carefully. Keep handling to a minimum, and be gentle. Measure and photograph fish quickly and gently, and get the fish back in the water as soon as possible.
- 5) When lipping small fish, let them hang vertically—don't crank the jaw. Doing so can damage the cartilage in its jaw making it difficult for the fish's mouth to function properly, reducing its chances of survival. Hold large fish horizontally to support the body evenly.
- 6) Revive the fish thoroughly before releasing it. In moving water, point fish into the current. In still water, gently slide it back and forth to force water through the gills until the fish is ready to swim away. When the fish tries to swim off, it's probably ready.

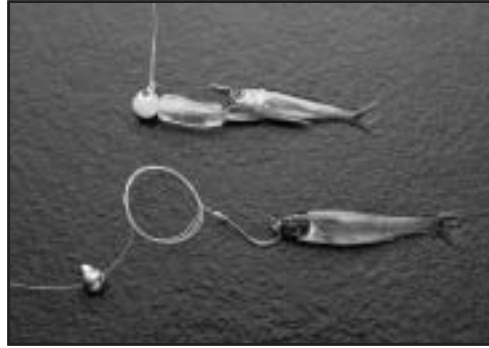

Short-Strike Remedy

When short-striking walleyes keep nipping the tail of your minnow and stealing your bait, a trailer hook is a logical solution. From my experience, most of the time that I add a trailer hook I lose the strikes. To combat this, I put on a very small minnow or half of a nightcrawler, and I sometimes even replace the jig with a hook and split-shot.

Match Bait Size for Salmon

When large schools of baitfish begin to show up while salmon fishing, pay attention to the size of the bait. Packaged anchovies and herring are usually mature fish. They can be twice the size of the baitfish on which the salmon are feeding. Cut your packaged bait down to match the size of the bait in the water. It will result in more strikes. For trolling, cut the head off at an angle (called a cut plug), leaving the body and tail about the size of the natural bait. For mooching, cut out a section between the head and the tail to bring it to the correct size. You will pick up more fish using the right-size bait.

Chicken Delight

To quickly trap a full load of minnows, place a fried chicken leg in your minnow trap. It works great. Also, I dip my bait in fried chicken oil. It has improved my catch.

Add Milk to Your Herring

Salmon fishermen know that salting herring overnight before fishing is a good way to toughen the bait so that they will stay on the hook well. The salt may also add a smell to attract salmon. Unfortunately, herring will often dry out and shrivel when salt is added. To prevent this, and to give your herring an attractive sheen, add a small can of evaporated milk when you salt them. The salt will still toughen the herring, but the milk will prevent them from shriveling up.

Liver Stable

Chicken livers are a great bait for catfish, but they often fall off the hook. To counter this problem, put the chicken livers in strawberry-banana Jell-O and let them sit for at least 24 hours. Afterward, the livers will stay on the hook better.

Get More Minnows into Your Round Trap

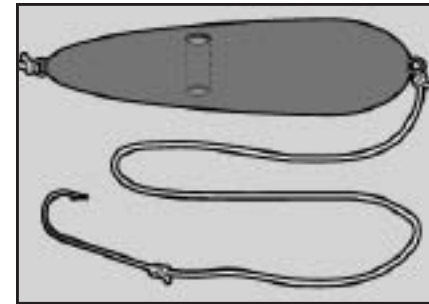
To lure more minnows into my round trap, I add a few special touches that work really well. I use the small cubes of aquarium fish food, designed to be pressed onto the inside glass of a fish tank. My favorite is the kind made from freeze-dried worms. With the trap apart, wet the cubes and pinch them between the tight wire mesh on the inside cones near the small openings. Bait both ends; I use two cubes per end. Once the minnows discover this enticement, it will create a traffic jam near the entrance, forcing much of the bait into the trap. For added attraction, you can spray the cones with your favorite scent or attractant. Mine is worm or crawfish. Be sure to spray from the inside out, with the trap apart, to avoid getting spray on the sides of the trap. Remember, you want the minnows headed for the door, not the sides. At night, put a small cyalume lightstick inside the trap. You can also attach the metal clip on top of the trap to the handle of a plastic jug so it will float just below the surface.

Bait from Ragweed

In mid to late summer, you may find that a worm has bored a hole into a ragweed stalk and is living inside it. Panfish love these worms. When you find stalks that have a hole in them, simply cut the stalks about 6 inches above and below the hole and take them with you. When you are ready to rig one, carefully split the stalk beginning at one end and use your finger to continue the split until you find the worm.

Try This Successful Rig

I have had huge success with this rig on lake or stream. I use the clear torpedo bubble with $\frac{3}{16}$ -inch hole drilled through to sink and cast with distance. Any type bait can be used: trailing approximately 18 to 24 inches behind the bubble. The bubble attracts fish while moving the bait behind.

Attracting Trout

Melt down Vaseline and add your favorite fish attractant to the mix. Once the Vaseline hardens, rub a light coat on your lure. I find this is most effective on trout.

Successful Netting

Have you ever wanted to net a fighting fish but accidentally missed because the hooks from the lure got tangled up in the net because it was hanging so low? To solve this, take a woman's hair band or a small, thick rubber band and wrap it around the handle. Pull the net through so it is flat. When the fish is in the net, the weight of the fish causes the bag to pull free of the hair band and the net opens up with the fish at the bottom.

Superline for Rod Repair

Don't throw away those last few yards of superline once you've filled your spool. Keep that braided line in your tackle box, along with a tube of industrial glue. I happened to have broken one of my favorite rods while up in Canada a few years ago, fishing for pike and walleye. My spinning rod broke at the rod seat. Whether it was because I tightened it down too much or because of the repeated stress of good strikes or a combination of both, I don't know. The portion of the rod that screws down on the reel broke, leaving my reel loose on the rod. Any pressure made the crack worse. To repair the rod, I put a bead of glue around the end of the broken reel seat and in the offending crack, then wrapped some spare superline around it, keeping it tight so the crack closed up. Once the glue started getting stiff, I put in another bead of glue and kept wrapping until there was about 1/16-inch of line around the broken reel seat. Another bead of glue made sure the glue would soak in all around, and I left it overnight to cure. That was 5 years ago, and it's still my favorite rod.

Eyes Have It

Use industrial-strength glue to attach small eyes onto worms, grubs, lead-head jigs, or even crankbaits. After reading a study that stated fish will often key in on their prey's eyes, I felt this addition would improve my chances of enticing a strike from finicky fish. It really works and is clearly a good idea. Many lure manufacturers are making soft baits with such eyes. I use small arts-and-crafts eyes purchased from Wal-Mart.

Basic Reel Maintenance

Having been in the reel-repair business for many years, I know what people might do to abuse their tackle. I fished salt and fresh water for a long time, and I still use some of those first reels in salt water. We learned to take care of them, and that meant cleaning and oiling them immediately after each trip — not the next day!

It's in the Bag

An inexpensive dust cover for your reels is the plastic bag in which your newspaper is delivered when it rains or snows. Just slip the rod butt and reel in, then secure it with a rubberband or twist-tie, and you're all set.

Versatile Sinker

For a versatile no-snap bottom-bouncer type sinker to be used for drifting or trolling for walleye or catfish, I use a three-way swivel. Then on the dropper use very heavy mono 6- to 8-inches with a knot tied to the bottom. Clamp on split-shot sinkers evenly spaced from bottom to top, as many as it takes to keep it on the bottom. More current or depth calls for more or heavier sinkers. Then, to keep the works from snagging, slip over it an equal length of surgical tubing and peg it to the hole in the three-way swivel. This rig works great — keeping your amount of tackle to the minimum because it is so versatile and changeable.

Underhand Casts

The underhand or flip cast is the approved method when you're on a high perch over the water fishing a pier, bridge or bulkhead when there are low overhangs or tree branches that might entangle your line. Here's how to do it: Point the rod tip straight out in front of you. Flip it down, whip it up again and let go of your line. Your lure won't cast as far as the sidearm or overhead cast, but it usually will fetch the opposite river or canal bank, perhaps providing more accuracy too.

Olive Oil for Your Rod?

When your fishing rod is not in use, spray a paper towel with olive oil and rub down your entire rod, including the cork handle. This retards cracking and allows the rod to perform smoothly.

A way to get more distance on your casting is to apply car wax to the insides of your line guides. After you buff them, they will be as slick as ice and your line will slide through the guides.

Long-Lasting Doughballs

If you like to fish for cats with doughballs, here's a tip that can save you money. Put your doughball on the hook like usual. Then, take a small piece of nylon hose and put it around the doughball. Fasten the nylon hose onto the line using a small rubber band. This will help your doughballs last longer, while allowing the scent to still be released. This is extremely effective in the warmer rivers down south, where the doughballs tend to fall off the hook after a short while.

When Carolina rigging, take a hypodermic needle and inject air into your bait. This will make it float higher in the water.

Straighten Out Your Leeches

In most cases, leeches tend to ball up on jigs and don't want to swim. To prevent this, slide a short piece of surgical tubing over the collar of the jig. Hook the leech far enough ahead of the sucker so the sucker can attach to the tubing. Leeches that attach themselves to something are less likely to ball up.

When you take them on your fishing trip, keep them cool. Place the minnow bucket in a cooler on top of ice or add ice to the bucket periodically during the day.

Add Scent and Action

My tip is something that I learned from an old Indian guide 30-plus years ago in Northwest Ontario. One natural way to add scent and action to a jig is to cut the bottom portion of skin from underneath a walleye's jaw (obviously, you do this to a walleye you are keeping to eat). This creates a natural "V" shaped chunk of fresh fish flesh. Insert the jig hook in the pointed end of the "V" and you'll have a natural, tough, scented jig trailer.

Increased Casting Distance

Keep Crawlers Crawling

For keeping worms and nightcrawlers tough and lively, I keep them in a foam-plastic cooler and use loose-weave white cotton dish cloths for bedding. I soak the dish cloths before using them to get rid of any filler, wring out excess water, and put them crumpled up into the cooler. This provides moisture, bedding and even food. No additional feeding is necessary. Worms and crawlers will become livelier and tougher in a couple of days. I keep the cooler outside in the shade, inserting a reusable freezer pack on hot days. I also use a smaller foam-plastic cooler with dish cloths to use for my day trips. Dish cloths should be taken out and rinsed every two or three weeks. Be sure they do not dry out!

Perch for Perch

Perch swim in schools, therefore you want to cast to the same spots as quickly as possible after a good strike. A good bait to use for this (where legal) is to take a perch, cut it open, and cut a strip of stomach lining 1/4-inch by 2 inches long, bait it on a small, thin bait holder hook and it will last for many bites. ***Note: Check your state's regulations to see if this practice is legal in your state.

Bottom Fishing

When bottom fishing for striped bass or catfish, I will make my cast and let it settle to the bottom. Then I will pull a little slack in my line in front of the reel and clip a small bobber on the line. When I get a strike or a pickup, the bobber is a sure giveaway.

No More Tangles

I fish in a small pond where my line frequently gets caught on logs and tree limbs under water. Instead of cutting the line whenever it breaks, I pull my line back, almost to the point of breaking, and then let the line out very fast. Most of the time this works great.

Baitcaster Backlashes

To prevent serious backlashes follow these directions. Make a long cast with your baitcaster, pull out your line another yard and take a piece of electrical tape and wrap it around the spool. This will prevent the spool from overrunning past the tape.

Side Arm Solutions

Side arm is the best way to cast if the wind is blowing strongly off the water because with the side cast, you'll be whipping your casting weight on a horizontal plane.

Light Up Your Minnow Rig

At night, when the perch bite slows or stops, try to prolong your success by adding some type of fluorescent attractant to your minnow rig. Soft-plastic glow-in-the-dark bait substitutes work great, but remember to charge them with your flashlight.

Minnow Rig Fishing for Perch

When fishing for yellow perch with a minnow rig, you may, at times, get stuck using a soft-tipped rod that makes it hard to both feel strikes and make a hookup. In this situation, it may be best just to let your minnow rest, slack lined, on the bottom for a minute or more. If there is a school of perch nearby, you have about a 50-50 chance that a perch will swallow your minnow. This method, of course, should only be used when you intend to keep your fish.

Coffee Can Leech Trap

Here's how to create a neat device for catching leeches for bait: Add a few fresh fish heads and some small rocks to the bottom of an empty 2-pound coffee can. Squeeze together the top of the can to form a narrow opening. Drill a couple of small holes near the top of the can, tie one end of a small rope to the can through the holes, then attach an empty jug to the other end of the rope as a marker buoy. Toss the can into a weedbed or tie off to a dock. Check the trap once a day for leeches and replace the fish heads with fresh ones every couple of days.

How to Rig Flying Fish

Use 300-pound-test wire as your harness to rig flying fish. Rig the harness through the eyes, then into the "wings". Use an 8/0 to 9/0 hook rig. The lead hook is above the wing; the trailing hook is in the tail. Stitch the fish to keep the lead hook in the bait. This is a particularly effective West Coast rig for big tuna and for marlin.

Beans for Bullheads

If you take kids fishing, go for bullheads. It is one of the easiest fish for kids to catch. A bait that is not only effective, but is also easy for the kids to put on themselves, is canned lima beans. This bait is cheap and keeps forever...even in the hot sun.

Dyeing Spinnerbaits

I use this tip to add life to an old, chrome, dual-blade spinnerbait. First, dye the blades with some shotgun barrel bluing that you can purchase from your local ammo/gun store. You can use cotton swabs to apply the bluing; make sure you follow the directions on the bottle. To keep the bluing on, I apply some clear-coat epoxy on top of it. You'll now have a spinnerbait that will work great. If I'm fishing with spinnerbaits, I use my dyed spinnerbaits 99% of the time. I catch both bass and pike on them. You can also add a pork trailer to double your chances.

Bait for Bait

Catch crickets for bait. Crickets make excellent bait for bass and panfish, and bread and sugar make excellent bait for crickets. Sprinkle the bread with sugar, lightly moisten, and leave the bread on the ground overnight beneath a cloth or newspaper. You'll collect a day's supply of bait.

A Bait Needle for Catfishermen

If you catfish with chicken livers, you know what a problem that can be. You make your cast and half the bait goes flying through the air. Well, here's a solution to the problem. Take a 6-inch piece of straight, thin wire—a paper clip will work—and about 1 inch from an end, make a loop by bending the wire. Snug the tag end to the main wire. Tie a leader onto a size 10 or larger treble hook. Slip the leader loop onto the loop in the wire. Now you have a "needle and thread." Darn the needle through a chunk of liver and slide the liver down onto the hook. Most of the liver will be threaded onto the leader and clinched at the end by the treble hook. This should end bait coming loose on the cast.

How many times have you lost a fish, while dead bait fishing, because you couldn't tell if a fish took your bait or not? Here's a sure-fire way to know. Once your bait is on the bottom, place a small bobber on your line near the rod tip. When the bobber's gone you know a fish has visited.

Remove light scratches from your fish locator display face by rubbing it with a baking soda toothpaste.

Bait-Fishing Strike Indicator

While bait fishing, I know my eyes often wander. That caused me to miss hits. One day, while messing around with my tackle, I discovered how to see a hit without watching the tip of the rod. I took a long bobber and hooked it on my line between the bottom guide—that is, the largest—and the next guide. Then I would let the float hang as I waited. Using this method, when you get a bite, the bobber will rise as the slack becomes scarce. Then I set the hook, unclip the bobber and try to reel in the fish. I hope this tip may help bait fishermen catch some fish, despite their wandering eyes.

If you want to make your live worms more enticing, soak them in beet juice overnight. In the morning, take them out and catch some fish.

Catching Bait Fish

Take a 2- to 5-gallon can or jug with a large screw-on lid. Cut 2 angle slots in the large removable lid 3 to 6 inches long, 1½ to 2½ inches wide, large enough for Wild Shiner's or bait to enter. Bait unit with a can of cat food. Cut small holes in food can. Release food at your discretion. Hang the large can (jug) off your dock. Bait or wild shiners can be harvested at your discretion. Use, save or sell the bait. Chum area over large can for better results. You can cast a net over the area after short term results. This makes excellent largemouth bass or catfish bait.

Save those broken rod tips. Glue or epoxy a 2- to 3-foot section of a broken rod tip into a ¼-inch drilled hole in a 1-inch-diameter wooden dowel. Clamp on a reel, and you have a custom ice fishing rod.

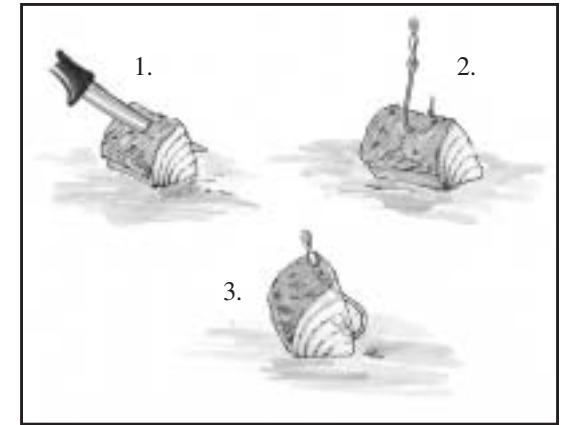
Baiting a Chunk

Here are simple step-by-step illustrations on rigging a chunk bait. This rig is effective on all coasts, but I find it to be particularly deadly on big tuna on the West Coast.

1. Cut a chunk of bait about 1 to 1½-inches wide and 2½ to 3½ inches long. Into that chunk cut a ¾-inch slit.
2. Insert the hook into the slit.
3. Turn the hook back toward the chunk. Reinsert the hook point and a small portion of the bend,

so that the point is hidden, but not buried so deeply that hooking the fish would be difficult. If you are using a swiveling hook, be sure to keep the swivel outside the chunk so that the hook may continue to turn freely.

Beware of Flying Liver

A "bait bag" is another neat way to keep chicken livers on your hook when fishing for cats. There are two ways you can make it: First, take a tiny 1- to 2-inch square, zippered plastic bag and punch little pencil holes in it. Stuff it with a chunk of liver. Now, just hook the bag anywhere and cast. No more lost bait, and when the cat takes the bag, he takes the hook too. Another method of making a bait bag is to use nylon stocking or small-mesh material. Cut some 2- x 4-inch pieces, fold them in half and stitch them on two sides, leaving an opening. Weave a piece of thread around the opening so you have a drawstring. You now have some 2-inch-square bait bags that will ooze scent and keep your bait on the hook. Just stuff the bag, tie the drawstring, hook the bag and cast.

Polished Lures

A simple and inexpensive way to customize your lures is to paint the lures with nail polish. This is great for when you're out on the water and your lure is just the wrong color. The polish only takes about five minutes to dry and comes in all colors of the rainbow and then some! There are also nail polishes that have sparkles in them for added flash.

Minnow Rig

When fishing a minnow jig, more often than not I will rig the minnow the following way: The hook should go in the mouth and then out the gill. The minnow is then slid up the hook so it is “kissing” the jig head. To keep the minnow “kissing” the jig head, I then bend the minnow slightly and run the hook up the belly and out the back. This rigging makes it easier to fish the weeds and puts the hook further back on the minnow to catch short-strikers. It does kill the minnow much quicker than other rigging options, but the fisherman has more control over the lure and can deliver his own action through an aggressive jigging action.

Lubricate Your Reel and Line

When they are not in use, spray your fishing reel, including the line, with WD-40 and put it away. The next time you use it you'll notice how smooth the outfit works. The WD-40 also keeps your line from getting brittle.

Double-Set Your Hook

When bait fishing for tough-mouthed fish (catfish, sturgeon, stripers, shark, etc.), it pays to “double-set” your hook. When you first notice your rod tip acting suspicious, pick up your rod and point the tip directly toward the fish. At the next nudge from the fish, give your reel a quick turn. When you feel weight, snap the rod to the 12 o'clock position. Quickly drop your rod to the water with a turn of your reel, set the hook again and hold on. You will land more fish with the double hookset.

I use aftershave or cologne to scent my dough balls for carp. It is quick and easy—it works great too!

Fire Up Your Baits

Are you tired of fish tearing up your soft plastics and crappie jigs? I have found a cheap, quick way to repair them. Simply take a match or lighter and apply the flame to the damaged part of the bait. The plastic will melt and cover the torn or damaged part of the bait. Then run under cold water to help the plastic harden faster. I have applied this method to some of my baits and have caught many more fish on them.

I find that two tubs of chicken livers bought at a store (not fresh) and mixed with 1 pound of chicken hearts (marinated overnight), will make the chicken hearts taste and smell like chicken livers. The chicken hearts, however, are harder to get off the hook, and the catfish love them.

Check Corn Fields for Sucker Bait

In early spring when you want to go sucker fishing, it can sometimes be hard to get bait. All you need to do is go to a corn stubble field, pull the stalks out of the ground and shake them. You will find enough “dew worms” to keep you fishing. Only take as many as you'll need and leave the rest for other fishermen and for your next fishing trip.

Spawn Bag Help

Here in Michigan, spawn bags are a very popular springtime bait for steelhead and brown trout. Unfortunately, the cold water often fades and discolors the spawn. One way to help keep the spawn looking fresh is to sprinkle the eggs with Jello in its powder form before tying the roe into spawn bags. I recommend using natural color Jello mix—reds and oranges. Strawberry Jello mix on steelhead spawn works best for me.

Float Flies Longer

For the trout fisherman, take some dry flies, and with scissors, cut some of the hackle off the belly of the flies. This will make the fly lay lower on the surface of the water and will make it more visible to the fish. Next time you are on a lake that is experiencing a massive shad kill—which usually occurs when shad are in shallow, cold water—scoop them up with your landing net and later cut them into bait-size pieces and freeze them. It's excellent catfish bait or chum, and it beats paying \$3 or more at the store. Be sure, however, of the relevant bait-harvesting laws before collecting the shad.

Fishing After a Cold Front

After a cold front, a lot of fishermen think that bass are completely uncatchable, but for those that have patience, the result will be rewarding. A good method of presentation is to take a 4- to 6-inch grape-colored worm and pitch it in next to boulders and weeds. Let it lie there for several minutes without moving it. This presentation, called “dead worm” by some anglers, proves itself a winner over and over.

Put Ketchup on Your Spoon

I always keep a couple of small packets of ketchup in my tackle box to use as a polish for spoons and spinner blades. Just smear the ketchup on the lure, wait two minutes and then rub off. It's safe and environmentally friendly.

Glitter for Power Baits

I bait fish with Power Bait and have found that the glitter they add really does attract fish over the non-glitter type. So I bought some glitter from a craft store and added it to the Power Bait. I simply take a ball of Power Bait and drop it in a plastic bag containing glitter. Then I shake the bag a little bit until the bait is covered in the glitter. When this bait hits the water, some of the glitter will come off and create a “puff” of glitter in the water. This attracts the trout to come and investigate. This method has doubled my catch. Now I don't go fishing without my bag of glitter.

Crayfish Tie

Improve your crayfish baiting by twisting one of two garbage-bag wire ties around the hook and then around the crayfish. Bare the wire for a stealthier set-up.

Keep Your Fly Dry

If you're having trouble keeping dry flies from sinking, I have a solution. Bring some Vaseline or vegetable oil on your next trip and grease the line. It won't hurt the fish and it will keep dry flies on the surface.

I have improvised an inexpensive panfish grub lure from white or colored pipe cleaners. Wrap three or four turns of pipe cleaner around a plain lead head jig. A slight bend to the hook shank improves appearance and is even more effective when fish scent is allowed to soak into the fibers.

Down Home Weed Eater

Fishing vegetation is fun and productive, but can be a pain in the neck. Hang ups commonly occur, usually resulting in lost lures. To remedy this problem I use a fillet knife taped to an extendable crappie pole. This will work on most any type of vegetation, including lily pads and hydrilla.

Turbo Spinner

Before tying on a spinner or other bait, just slip a small prop and bead on the line. This creates extra flash, vibration and a turbulence of bubbles. Good all around, whether buzzing, free falling or just cranking.

Slowing Down Superlines

When using superlines, the arbor often turns without retrieving the line. You might think that your drag mechanism isn't working properly, but that's not the case. To solve this problem, I put a rubber band around the arbor, then put the superline over the rubber band. This way you won't need monofilament for backing.

Clean Old Tackle

Here's a good way to clean corrosion from old reels and rods that have been used in salt water. Put some white vinegar in a bowl and soak a toothbrush in it (use a hard-bristle brush). Dip the brush in the vinegar and scrub the corrosion on the rod or reel. Rinse off with clean water. I like to wipe them with WD-40. I buy a lot of old rods and reels at public auctions, and after they are cleaned up, I have nice outfits for next to nothing.

Here's an easy-to-make reel cover. Take an old tube sock, cut off the toes and slide your reel into it. You can secure the reel with a twist-tie or a rubber band at each end.

Not Your Average Cast

When I was out fly fishing during the summer, I saw a group of good-size bass in a slow current spot on the river. I wanted to find a new approach to getting them to strike. I reached over and grabbed a leaf and set my fly on it. I gave myself a lot of slack so my fly would drift right to the spot I wanted. When my fly got close enough for the bass to see it, I started shaking my line until the fly fell off. I think the fly falling off the leaf resembled an ant falling off a piece of bark or leaf. This method proved very worthy. I caught 3 out of the 5 bass.

Casting Remedy

Whenever you cast a bait over a limb, there's a trick to getting it free. When the lure swings back and forth, don't wait until it moves away from you, because it puts the bait in line with the branch and it usually gets caught when you apply pressure. The 'secret' lies in waiting until the lure swings towards you then pull the rod so the lure is thrown back and over the limb.

Reuse Old Worms

I fish with plastic worms and spinnerbaits a lot. When the plastic worms become no longer usable Texas style, I cut the tops off and use them on the spinnerbaits as trailers. If they are straight tail worms, I split the tail in half to get more action out of them.

Make-It-Yourself Treble Hook

Tackle shops sell "soft bait" treble hooks for about 50 cents per piece. They are easy to make at home for much less. Just take the springs out of cheap ball-point pens (or buy springs at a craft store), cut them to the length of the shank of a treble hook and slide it down the shank. Now pinch the last coil of the spring around the shank of the hook. Now you have a "soft bait" treble that is just as good as any bought in a store.

Clean Your Reel

Cleaning and oiling a fishing reel can be simplified. First, take the reel apart and lay out the pieces on a sheet of waxed paper. Next, wipe the pieces off with a clean, lint-free cloth. Then use a spray cleaner designed for cleaning electronic components (it doesn't have any chemicals that will harm the surface) such as Endust for Electronics. Wipe the pieces thoroughly with a clean, lint-free cloth. Then use a white lithium-based grease for the gears and other areas that need greasing. Last, put the reel back together and spray it with a silicone-based lubricant. The lubricant penetrates throughout the reel and lasts for a long time.

Super Scaling

This tip will help fellow members who scale their fish. I mostly use this on panfish. First you take your bluegill and place it tail first on the clip-type gutting board. Then you take a garden hose, put the nozzle on 'stream' and blow the scales off from the tail to the head. I have scaled 30 panfish in 5 to 10 minutes this way and did not get any scales on me.

Keep a Cleaning Cloth Handy

I keep an old piece of cotton in my tackle box. It has been heavily sprayed with silicone spray. I use it to polish spoons and to wipe down my rods and reels at the end of each outing, after rinsing them down with fresh water. This keeps the reel from rusting and makes for longer casts with clean rod guides.

Worm Saver

Have trouble keeping worms alive on long trips? Boy, I did—until I saw my grandma working in the garden. She used potting mix and she complained that she couldn't keep the worms out of it. Bingo! I had an idea. Put my worms in the potting mix! It's easy and cheap. Get yourself a bag of potting soil. A 10-pound bag lasts a long time. Also, get a bag of vermiculite. Mix about 2 cups of vermiculite into about 5 pounds of potting soil and put it in a clean 5-gallon paint bucket or other lidded bucket. Put in your worms and add another 2 or 3 inches of the potting soil. Keep moist, and your worms will stay fresh.

Your Own Worm Supply

You can have live nightcrawlers and worms anytime you want them in spring or summer, and you don't have to pay the high cost of bait. Furthermore, at times when bait shops don't have crawlers or worms because of lengthy droughts, for example, you will have an ample supply. You simply need to raise them yourself. To do this, dig a hole in the ground that extends below the frost level. Install a 60-gallon trash can in the hole. Mix moist leaves, used coffee grounds and worm food, then place the mixture in the trash can. Finally, put your initial investment of worms and/or nightcrawlers in the trash can. A few things to remember: Never use oak leaves or grass clippings; remove dead nightcrawlers or worms; and keep leaves moist, but not wet.

There is a correct way to thaw fish. A frozen fish should be thawed slowly. Either put it in the refrigerator for 24 hours before cooking or place it in cold water to thaw. When fishing in extremely cold temperatures, trim your line close to your knot. That prevents icing up so not to affect the wobble of your lures.

Backlash Help



No fishing time is more wasted than that spent picking out backlashes. Here are two tips to reduce this bane. First, the second you get a backlash, place your thumb firmly on the spool line and make several complete handle turns. Ninety percent of those "muss-ups" will easily unravel. Second, braided lines make impossible-to-pick-out backlashes because the slick line cuts through to the spool axle. To thwart this, make your longest cast, then place a strip of plastic tape across the line. Retrieve, winding over the tape, and that's as deep as any backlash can penetrate, making "pickouts" easier.

When I buy a new reel, the factory sends a parts diagram with an exploded view. Unfortunately, the diagrams are usually so small I can't recognize the parts. 
